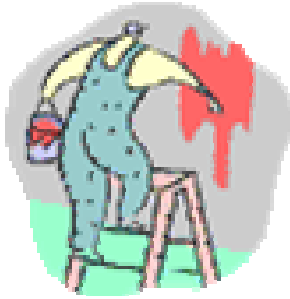
- The Board has selected a new pond management company. Foster Lake and Pond Management has been retained to maintain the pond located near Chowning's Place.
